

Working for Sheffield Children's Hospital:

The Sheffield Children's Hospital Trust supplies the physical and emotional needs of the children of Sheffield, providing the main acute hospital, CAMHS, and community services, as well as being a secondary and tertiary referral centre, receiving patients from South Yorkshire, South Yorkshire, North Derbyshire, Bassetlaw and North Lincolnshire and Goole. The Trust is proud to provide integrated care for critical, medical, mental health and community health needs. The hospital is an accredited Trauma Centre, and funding has almost been completed for a new helipad. See it being build next year!

You will work with a team of diverse consultant colleagues within the PSU team, each with strengths in different areas, and with support from them all. The nursing teams supporting the work are dedicated, knowledgeable and provide an integrated approach to childcare. You will find clinical, managerial and academic projects to reflect your interests.

The hospital is situated on the south-west aspect of Sheffield approximately one mile from the city centre. It is a combination of the original Victorian architecture and new build with a glorious atrium. It is close to the Royal Hallamshire Hospital, (incorporating the Jessop wing-obstetrics and neonatology) the Charles Clifford Dental Hospital, Weston Park Hospital, the Medical School and the main University Campus. Nearby are cafes and restaurants, and a busy University neighbourhood.

We have excellent relationships with our colleagues from all stakeholders. These include the neonatal team; the urology team who have a UK renowned reconstructive service, lead until recently by Prof Chris Chapple; one of the only UK accredited Congenital Anomalies of Gynae services, led by Prof Swati Jha; and we have support from our excellent adult stones team.

Additionally, we have a great relationship with our fetomaternal colleagues, who are world leading in their research and development of fetal MR. This will be an exciting area of research for the future.

The hospital hosts an excellent clinical research unit, and we support the UK Professor for Child Technology, Professor Paul Dimitri, so technology innovation runs in the bones of the hospital.

A new programme of human factors training and focus has been launched in the last 2 years, and the candidate would be welcome to contribute. Additionally, the Children's Advanced Trauma course is unique in the UK, for focused and realistic teaching for children.

We are currently working with our integrated care boards on multiple projects to improve the equitability and quality of care throughout the region, providing excellent opportunities to use creativity to improve childcare.

We have a great supportive operations management team we work closely with to improve the service.
