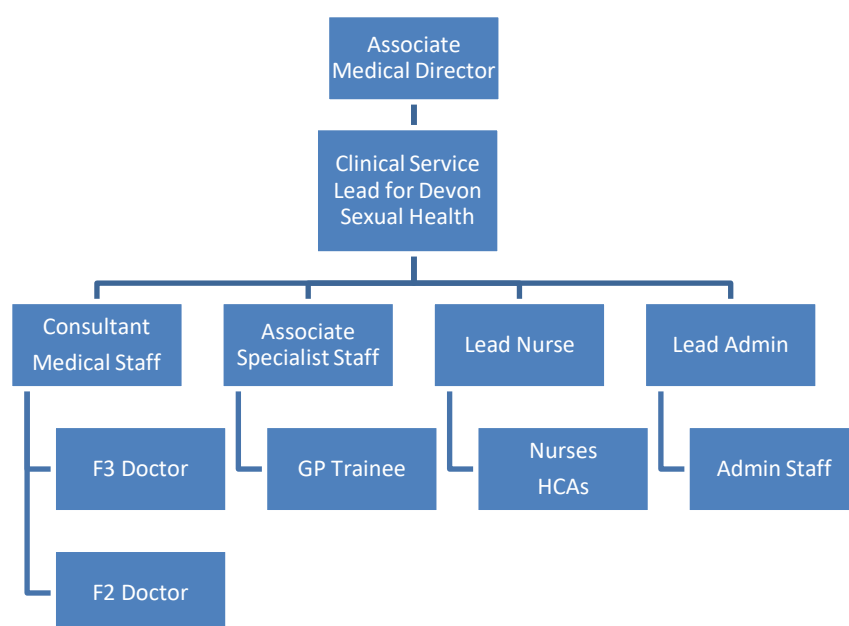

Job overview

- This is a new post designed to support the delivery of high quality integrated sexual health and contraception care
- The successful candidate will be supported in developing independent competence in managing common and complex Sexual Health presentations and common Contraception presentations.
- Teaching and training of medical students, other junior doctors, nurses and other staff
- Participation in audit and quality assurance and improvement processes
- Participation in Research

Main duties of the job

The postholder will undertake regular sexual health clinics. The postholder will need to cover basic contraception care within sexual health clinics and cover basic contraception clinics in the event of staff absence. The principle requirement for clinical face to face input is currently sited at Castle Circus Health Centre, with

remote consultation clinics worked either on site or at home. There is a possibility of clinics taking place at Newton Abbot and Paignton Hospitals in 2022/23.

You will be expected to participate in a variety of professional activities to support your personal clinical practice and the overall work of the department and Trust. Time will be allocated, within the sexual health part of the contract, to enable professional development, for example to support training towards achieving your dip-GUM, DFSRH and/ or Letters of Competence for insertion of intra-uterine devices and sub dermal implants. Specifically, you will be expected to participate in Quality Improvement projects, ongoing research activities and teaching of medical students and other allied health professionals.

About your new team and department

Our acute hospital is big enough to provide genuine opportunities for innovation and research, but small enough for your work to make a real impact. We have close-knit teams with quick lines of communication and that means we make things happen.

The Sexual Health team is a small multi-disciplinary team based at Castle Circus Health Centre. Our aim is to provide sexual health services that support healthy relationships and sexual well-being in Torbay and South Devon in a caring and non-judgemental way.

Detailed job description and responsibilities

Communication and working relationships

- You will work closely with other medical staff, allied health professionals and non-clinical colleagues both within the department and in other specialties.

Planning and organisation

- Time management and prioritisation skills will be needed to effectively manage clinical workload.

Analytical and judgement

- The post holder will be able to deliver high quality clinical care and seek appropriate support when needed

Responsibility for patients and client care

- The post holder will work as part of senior doctor led MDTs

Policy and service responsibility

- It is anticipated that the post holder will contribute to local service development

Responsibility for finance, equipment and other resources

- The post holder will provide efficient and effective care that is consistent with local public health priorities

Responsibility for supervision, leadership and management

- The post holder will contribute to education and training of medical students and new junior doctors joining the department

Information technology and administrative duties

- A willingness to engage with new developments in information technology is essential

Responsibility for research and development

- There are research opportunities within the service and a supportive Trust research team, should the appointee wish to participate in research. The NIHR STI Research Champion for the South West Peninsula is based within the Devon Sexual Health service.
