Job Title: Clinical Coding Divisional Lead NHS AfC: Band 6

Accountable to: Head of Clinical Coding

Responsible for: Senior Clinical Coders

Key Relationships with: Clinicians, Operational Teams, Health Records, Information, Finance and

Planning and Commissioning Team.

Purpose of Role:

This means specific accountability to:

- You will be responsible for ensuring that national coding rules and conventions are followed and standards adhered to. The requirement is to take over the current in-depth coding and validations with the clinicians at the trust and develop it further; ensuring the high standard of clinical coding is maintained and developed.
- Analyse and code clinical notes using ICD10 and OPCS 4._ classifications.
- To mentor a section of the coding department, to ensure accurate, timely and consistent clinical coding within set standards and targets. To provide the Divisions with a high quality, comprehensive Clinical Coding service.
- To set up and perform internal coding validations within Women and Children division, by analysing and identifying variances against benchmarks.
- Assist the Clinical Coding site Manager to develop implement and maintain the clinical engagement with the clinicians at Divisional level.

Key Responsibilities:

- To be responsible for data validation with the clinicians in their own specialty (i.e. Surgery, Medical or Women & Children) and to be prepared to work for up to two years in a specialty.
- To liaise with clinicians and their support staff concerning interpretation of case note documentation affecting coding.
- To accurately abstract and interpret clinical data for coding inpatient data using ICD10 and OPCS 4._ classifications and input the data onto the patient administration system (PAS)/Careflow EPR
- To mentor a sub-set of the clinical coding team.
- To assist the Clinical Coding site Manager and the Auditor/Trainer on preparation of local agreements and coding policies.
- To assist clinical coders prioritise their work load
- To work with the Clinical Coding site Manager to ensure all coding timescale are met and ensure Clinical Coders meet their targets.



- To investigate, and correct complex clinical coding data rejected or queried by recipient information systems and advise the Data Standards Manager of such problems that could impact on Trust Performance.
- To participate in on-going clinical coding training to meet national standards and Trust requirements. This may require travelling to other organisations outside of core working hours.
- To attend clinical coding related meetings as directed by the Clinical site Coding site Manager. This may require travelling to other organisations outside of core working hours
- Any other duties, appropriate to the grade as required.
- Work with the Training lead and Auditor to implement action plans from internal and external reviews, audits, validation exercises and other related activities and requirements.
- To provide a mentoring role to Trainee Clinical Coders, communicating complex rules and supporting development of skills.
- To provide relevant information needed for research, audit and commissioning to support decision making by clinicians and managers.
- To contribute to the resolution of documentation issues and coding queries by consulting with the Clinical Coding Trainer and site Manager, and by liaising with medical staff for clarification of information.
- To contribute to the impact for clinical coding, of the implementation of HRG v4 and provide an audit function to test the implementation and recording requirements.
- To work with the Clinical Coding Trainer to ensure that training is maintained where necessary to sustain audit recommendations and monitor accordingly.
- To participate in external events to maintain expertise and continually improve the quality of the audit programme.
- To participate in the ongoing training to meet national standards, Trust and National requirements including attending ICD and OPCS4._ refresher courses as required.
- Provide an audit validation to new services in terms of coding of activity for all new developed services within the trust.

General

- To be responsible for complying with Trust and local Safeguarding policies and procedures.
- To be responsible for the quality of data recorded. The data should be accurate, legible (if hand written), recorded in a timely manner, kept up to date and appropriately filed.
