<u>ALL STAFF</u> IN THIS GROUP ARE TO BE SEEN IN OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH (OH) PRIOR TO OR ON THE FIRST DAY OF WORKING IN THE TRUST. Without documentary clearance from the occupational health department at The Royal Marsden Hospital or Chelsea and Westminster Hospital new employees are not permitted to undertake exposure prone procedures.

Taking all immunisation details to the appointment in OH might help prevent any delays.

*Exposure prone procedure (EPP)

"Exposure prone procedures (EPP) are those where there is a risk that injury to the worker may result in the exposure of the patient's open tissues to the blood of the worker. These include procedures where the worker's gloved hands may be in contact with sharp instruments, needle tips and sharp tissues (e.g. spicules of bone or teeth) inside the patients open body cavity, wound or confined anatomical space where the hands or fingertips may not be completely visible at all times". BBV Infection Control and Exposure Prone Procedures The new employee must contact the occupational health department to make the necessary arrangements to be seen. The manager is responsible for ensuring that the individual attends and on completion an attendance form will be stamped by occupational health.

Department managers where the exposure prone procedures are undertaken are responsible for ensuring that clearance has been received before the procedure has been commenced.

EPP Workers are required to be seen in Occupational Health **before** commencing Exposure Prone Procedures. Only when clearance is given by OH will the worker be allowed to commence EPP.
