

JOB DESCRIPTION

Job Title: Neonatal Community Nurse

Band: 6

Department: Neonatal Unit

Responsible to: Neonatal Community Sister

Accountable to: Matron for Paediatrics and Neonates

Job summary:

To use specialist Neonatal nursing skills to promote an integrated nursing service to sick infants and their families between hospital and community and enable infants to be cared for at home whenever possible. To act as a resource for both primary health care and secondary health care where specialist Neonatal expertise is required.

Professional responsibilities:

- 1. To maintain adequate and appropriate records of patients and supply information as required in line with Trust Policy.
- 2. To develop policies and protocols alongside team members to enhance delivery of effective patient care and to adhere to NMC guidelines, and Network and Trust policies.
- 3. Have sound knowledge of clinical governance issues, promoting evidence-based practice.
- 4. To assist in maintaining safety of personnel, environment and equipment.
- 5. To act as a mentor/role model for students and staff, taking them out on the community for work experience
- 6. To assist with the teaching/training of both hospital/community staff involved in Neonatal care. Aid the professional development of team members and within the multidisciplinary team as appropriate.
- 7. To highlight social and safeguarding concerns and refer as necessary. To participate in case conferences and other safeguarding meetings. To have sound knowledge of child safeguarding procedures.
- 8. Act as a resource for members of the multidisciplinary team.
- 9. Empower parents and carers to enable them to safely care for their child within the community environment through education, support and risk assessment.

Clinical:

- 1. To work alongside the primary healthcare team, participating in and supporting the nursing care of infants, enabling them to be cared for in their own home.
- 2. To work with the multidisciplinary team to aid the discharge planning process and lead where appropriate.
- 3. Follow up patients as required, supervising treatments and the use of equipment and supporting the family as necessary.
- 4. Liaise and work closely with members of acute healthcare and multidisciplinary teams to provide best possible integration of services for infants and their families.
- 5. Utilise current evidence based knowledge practice to provide and maintain high standards of care, promoting health potential and equality for all infants and their families.
- 6. Assess, plan, implement and evaluate nursing care programmes in partnership and negotiation with families enabling them to be cared for at home/community setting
- 7. To provide on call cover for palliative cases in the community
- 8. To maintain your own personal development and profile.
- 9. Consolidate and extend own clinical skills in all aspects of nursing, furthering own professional knowledge in a rapidly changing environment
- 10. To be able to manage own workload effectively
